Welcome and Introductions

Nutty Passions Exercise

- The Squirrel/Nut passion exercise is an icebreaker designed to provide an opportunity for participants to share what their passions are and what is important to them in their personal and professional lives. This activity was created by Stacy Powell, manager of the Prototypes Black Infant Health program in Pomona.

LABBC-Center for Healthy Births Update

- Town Hall: September 22, 2005. There were 164 participants representing 113 organizations of Los Angeles County. From the information exchanged at the round tables the Center was able to create informational posters to be displayed at the Perinatal Summit. The information was also transferred into part a document that would be presented to health care leaders the second day of the Summit. Such topics as Priority Areas, Desired Results and Actions were discussed.
- Perinatal Summit: October 24-24, 2005. There were 170 participants representing 60 organizations at the Summit. The goal to identify the five key perinatal issues and recommended intervention for systems change to be presented to health care leaders on the second day of the summit was accomplished. Health care leaders did make a commitment to the recommended interventions. A report will be released January 2006 containing further information about their commitments.

Getting Acquainted Activity

- This activity was a work sheet that each individual person filled out a response to in each category. The purpose of the activity was to begin trust building within this HBLC. Participants responded to the questions
