- **Increase collaboration between community agencies offering health related services**

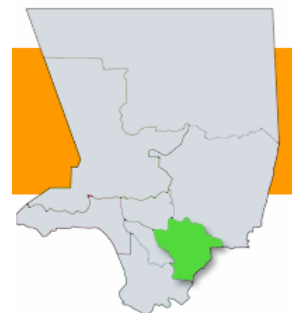
### Actions

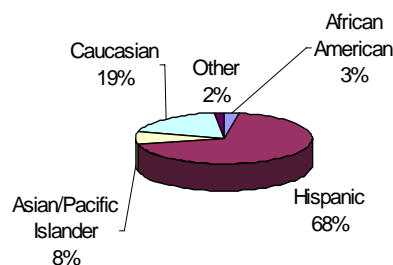

## SPA 7 HBL.C Community



**Total Population: 1,285,210**

### Age:

- 0 to 5 yrs – 10.6 %
- 6 to 9 yrs – 7.7 %
- 10 to 14 yrs – 8.5 %
- 15 to 17 yrs – 4.8 %
- 18 to 24 yrs – 10.9 %
- 25 to 34 yrs – 16.2 %
- 35 yrs and over – 41.1%



## SPA 7 Perinatal Facts

### Between 1996 and 2002:

- Overall, in SPA 7 infant mortality decreased by 17.5%
- In SPA 7 infant mortality decreased by 34.4% among African American, 32.3% among White, and 9.6% among Hispanic families
- In SPA 7 African American infant mortality is 3.0 times higher than White and Hispanic infant mortality rates
- Similar to SPA 1, infant mortality in SPA 7 among African American families increased incrementally since 1999 from 8.9 (per 1,000 live births) to 14.1 (per 1,000 live births)
